

CANADA: PERMANENT RESIDENCE (EXPRESS ENTRY) PROCESS MAP

STEP 6: PR CARD

The PR card will be delivered to the applicants address within a month.

STEP 5: CONFIRMATION OF PR (COPR)

Upon approval of the PR, the employee will receive a COPR. If the applicant is not yet in Canada, the COPR must be activated by 'landing' into Canada and obtaining signature from the immigration officer.

STEP 4: INVITATION TO APPLY

Once an ITA is received, the application must be submitted within 60 days.
Processing time: 6 months



STEP 1: INITIATION

Client initiates the case with FGI. FGI assesses applicant for Express Entry. We suggest the applicant to obtain their language results from either ILETS or CELIP before initiation as this can influence their score dramatically.

STEP 2: PREPARATION OF APPLICATION FORMS

Once all documentation is received, FGI will proceed with case preparation. After FGI completes the case, the submission package will be sent to candidate for review.
Estimated Turnaround: 5 days

STEP 3: EXPRESS ENTRY SUBMISSION

FGI will submit the Express Entry application. Depending on the points calculated, the applicant may receive an Invitation to Apply (ITA) in the next draw or subsequent draws.
