

FAST-TRACK SCHEME PROCESS MAP

STEP 9: ISSUANCE OF RESIDENCE CARD

The Residence Card for the applicant (and Residence Cards for accompanying dependents) will be delivered to the Danish address used for local registration (CPR) via post or Danish company.
Processing time: 1 month

STEP 8: LOCAL REGISTRATION

All applicants must register their legal presence in Denmark and address with the local registration office to activate their CPR number. For assignments of less than 3 months, a CPR number will not be issued, but a tax number will be necessary which should be applied for at the local tax center.

STEP 7: POSTED WORKER NOTIFICATION

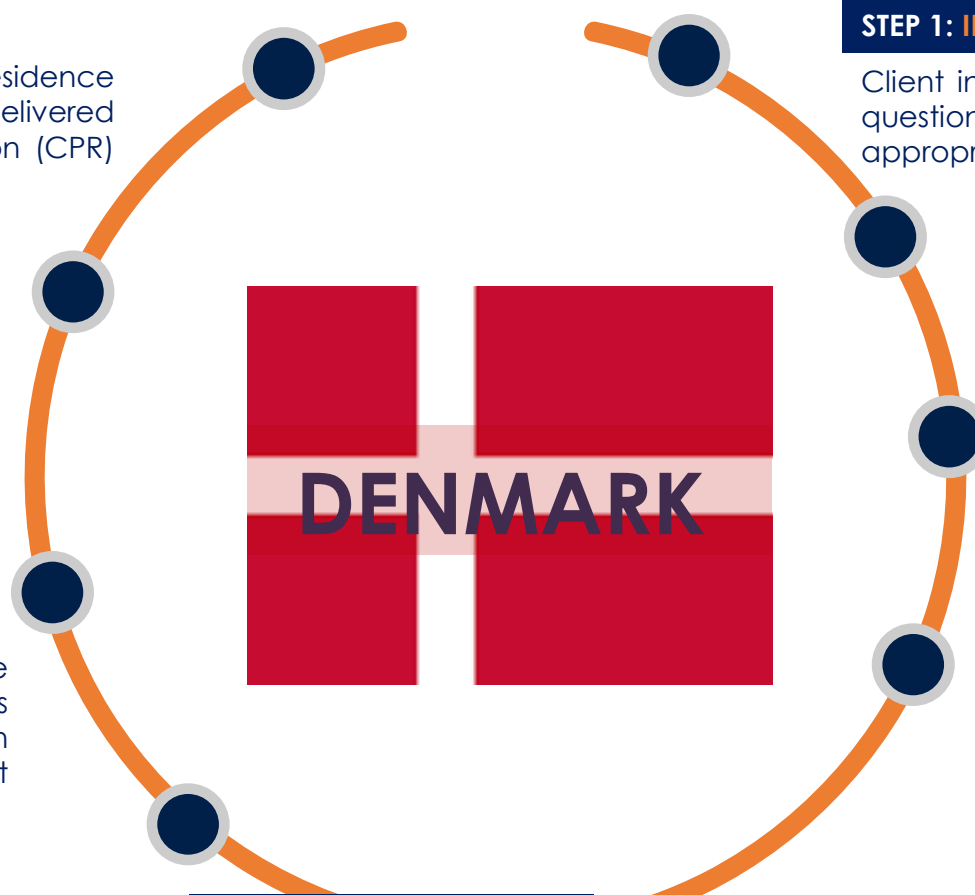
If contracted to perform services in Denmark the sending company and any individual assignments should be registered with the Register for Foreign Service Providers (RUT) online on or before the first day of assignment

STEP 6: ENTRY TO DENMARK

The applicant (and accompanying dependents) may enter Denmark and may begin working. The passport(s) with the endorsed visa(s) should be stamped at the port of entry.

STEP 5: VISA COLLECTION

Once SIRI has approved a work and residence permit, the applicant needs to visit the nearest consulate to collect an entry visa.



STEP 1: INITIATION

Client initiates the case with FGI and submits a completed questionnaire. FGI determines the category and send the appropriate document checklist.

STEP 2: CASE ORDER AND PAYMENT

Before submitting an application for a work and residence permit, a Case Order ID must be created online and the fees paid in advance.

STEP 3: WORK & RESIDENCE PERMIT APPLICATION

FGI submits the application is to the Danish Agency for International Recruitment and Integration online.
Processing time: 1 day

STEP 4: BIOMETRIC DATA AND SECURITY CHECKS

The Danish Agency for International Recruitment and Integration (SIRI) can only begin processing the work and residence permit application after biometrics have been recorded. Within 14 days of the application submission, the applicant must appear in person at SIRI, or at a Danish consulate/VFS Centre (if they are not in Denmark).
